



Accessibility for sensory disability

At each hospital, lifts have automatic voice announcements at each floor and lift buttons are in braille.

Auslan interpreters can be arranged for d/Deaf or hard of hearing patients. Find out more about our interpreter services.

Guide dogs, audio dogs and other therapy animals are encouraged to accompany people around the hospital. If you need help with toileting animals and giving them access to drinking water, talk to Reception or your care staff.


Social Scripts

- Requests can come from patients, carers or staff
- Each Sensory box is customised to the patient's sensory preferences, considering if the toy is safe for the individual patient
- The ward staff will contact DLO for sensory box collection when patient is discharged or no longer wanting the items






Sensory Box Example
